A new project will work strategically along the Moonee Ponds Creek, Strathmore, to protect and conserve threatened species and ecological communities. These include the Growling Grass Frog, Swift Parrot, Grey-headed Flying Fox and the critically endangered Grassy Eucalypt Woodland of the Victorian Volcanic Plain and the Natural Temperate Grassland of the Victorian Volcanic Plain. The project will enhance habitat and linkages for migratory birds, control Weeds of National Significance and erosion, create buffer zones for storm water run-off, and assist water quality through filtration. Participants will work in partnership with surrounding land managers including Moreland City Council and Melbourne Water as well as contractors, school groups and 'Friends' groups.

Melbourne Water will commence the upgrade of the Jacana Retarding Basin in March and work will continue until August 2016.


IMPACTS ON LOCAL RESIDENTS and VISITORS

As with all major projects within residential areas, they anticipate some impacts including:

- increase in number of truck movements through the Gowanbrae Estate
- temporary closure and diversion of Moonee Ponds Creek Trail through Moonee Boulevard and Valley Crescent, Glenroy
- residents in the immediate vicinity of the work area will experience some noise and dust, and may experience vibration from the works.

To reduce these impacts we aim to:

- undertake works Monday to Friday 7.00am to 6.00pm only
- use water suppression carts where necessary to reduce dust and stop works if dust levels are deemed too high
- liaise with local community
- introduce controls to minimise impact on local fauna and flora.

MELBOURNE Water REPORT

Additional revegetation on Moonee Ponds Creek downstream of Five Mile Creek was planted a few months ago as part of a current capital revegetation project. A trial of removing the herbaceous weeds and replacing the jute matt and salt bush had been largely successful, until the high flows came about a month ago. As a result, a clean-up of tree guards will be undertaken.

A recently reviewed Corridors of Green application by Moreland City Council on the Moonee Ponds Creek to undertake revegetation at Oak Park has been accepted. This will compliment capital works Melbourne Water is commencing in the area and provide further amenity. It is hoped in future a wetland swale may be incorporated into the site.

CREEK WATCH

Rapid change of water levels or discolouration of problems along the creek that need to be reported:

- A High water flows coming out of drains during a period of <u>no rain</u> could indicate a leaking water main or underground burst pipe. To report this, contact Yarra Valley Water for the east side of the bank and City West Water for the west side of the bank.
- If the creek water is yellow or white or otherwise discoloured, this could indicate trade waste being dumped into the creek. This needs to be urgently reported to the EPA.
